FACES is committed to creating a safe space for the BC community on racial justice issues and advancing the understanding of how systemic racism perpetuates and impacts our society.

The FACES team consists of a diverse group of individuals who stimulate dialogue and facilitate the continuation of education and growth through challenging individuals to address their own biases and prejudices.

The idea for FACES began in 2002, when two football players discussed the need for a more inclusive culture at Simon Fraser University on campus, they became friends and for a group on campus to address racial justice issues. After 12 different members and administrators were consulted, and in the summer of 2004, Dr. Little Albert became the first Advisor. She helped organize the students and provided guidance, focus and direction. In 2005, FACES became an officially registered student organization (RSO). In the same year, FACES received three awards, one for each of Creativity Award, Faculty Advisor, and Student Organization of the Year.
