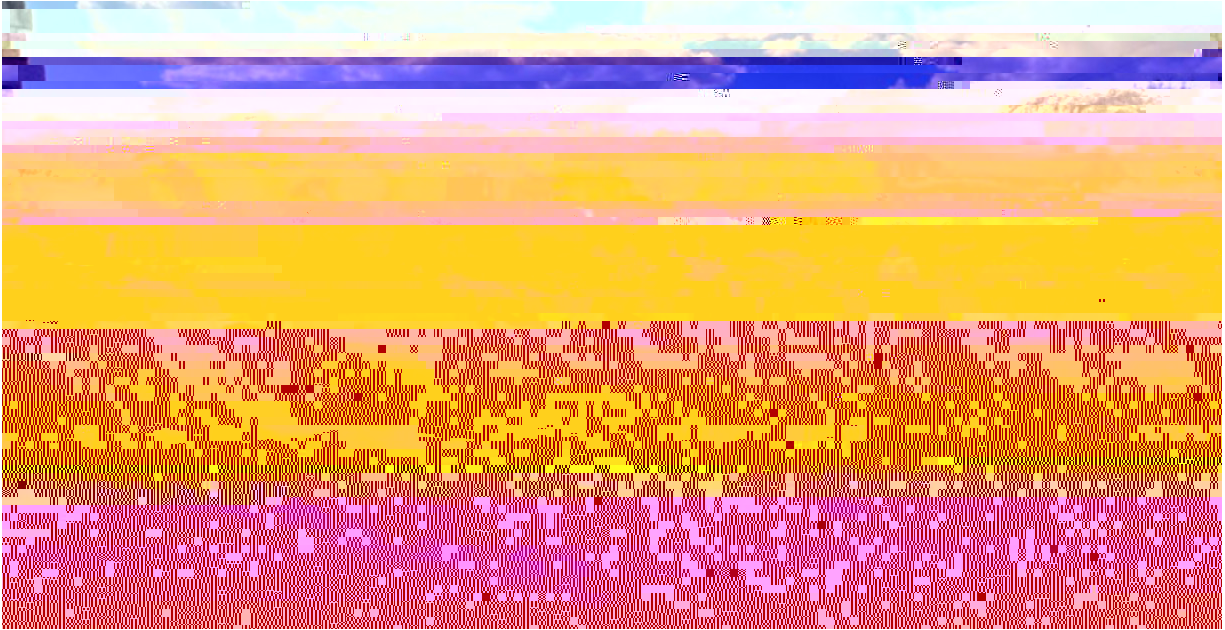

Need an unofficial transcript for job applications?

Your Degree Audit may serve as an unofficial transcript. Go to Agora to request your current degree audit by clicking on "EA Degree Audit" under Academics and Courses. Then, click on the "run declared program" button and wait for the audit to load. Once it is loaded, click the "printer friendly" button in the top right and save the audit as a PDF. Once saved, upload it to Handshake within the "Documents" section of your Profile.

Should You Accept Your Summer Offer or Keep Interviewing?

If you had a positive summer experience and are satisfied with the offer, it's wise to accept. Campus recruiting will likely extend beyond your decision deadline, but remember: you know more about your summer job than any new offer, so accepting carries less risk. Many students who delay accepting and ~~could be rejected by declining the offer~~ ~~and then regret not accepting their original offer.~~

Considerations for Declining

Holding multiple offers can take opportunities from classmates and reflects poorly on both you and your school. If you're considering a different industry, it's better to decline and strategize your job search. Don't settle for a job you're not excited about—your hard work deserves better. Be prepared to put effort into your job search, leveraging resources like alumni networks and beyond campus recruiting.

Reneging an Offer

Don't wait until the last minute to ask, as this could reflect poorly on your foresight and work ethic.

Be clear, honest, and diplomatic in your request. Employers are experienced with these situations and will likely understand your reasoning.
